1. IEEE Journal on Selected Areas of Communications
- Topic varies according to specific issue

- Submissions must be relevant to current call for papers.

- 12 issues a year - Length 20 doubles spaced pages (12 point font)

2. IEEE Network

- Broad network topic journal which encompasses multimedia.

- 6 issues a year

- Submissions are PDFs submitted via email which simply need to be readable, no formatting required.

Accepted articles have additional requirements.

- Fairly broad journal covering all areas of communications.
 12 issues a year with specific topic call for papers, but also open submission for continual topics.

 - Final submissions require a little more work.

4. IEEE Transactions on Multimedia

- Covers semi-narrow range of topics in multimedia.
- 8 issues a year with special issues interspersed. Open submission.
- Very strict submission guidelines. 30 double spaced pages max, additional final submission stuff.
